Entry Requirements

CA Program graduates who have qualified for the Graduate Diploma of Chartered Accounting are eligible to apply for the Master of Applied Taxation and receive credit for four courses. This means you can study part-time for only 12 months to complete the Master of Applied Taxation degree.

Entry to an Atax Masters degree usually requires a credit average or higher in your undergraduate degree. However, your level of achievement in the GradDipCA and your professional experience will also be taken into account.

Professional Year (PY) graduates who have completed at least 3 CA Program modules to qualify for the Grad Dip (ICAA) award are also eligible for entry and exemptions in the Master of Applied Taxation.

CA Program graduates can also claim advanced standing towards the Master of Taxation or Master of International Taxation programs offered by Atax.
